We are committed to ensuring our natural gas pipelines are safe and reliable.

Training and Education

Training sessions are provided to personnel, contractors, excavators and plumbers, to educate the public on natural gas safety.

Pressure Testing and Analysis

Pipeline pressure undergoes testing, and failed components are analyzed to enhance system performance.

Leak Detection and Repairs

Regular inspections identify pipeline leaks, which are promptly repaired, along with the replacement of aging sections.

Emergency Preparedness

Drills are conducted to maintain readiness for swift response in case of an emergency.

Quick Response

Companywide our crews respond to incidents on average in under 23 minutes.

Clear Communication

When needed, gas meters are turned off for customer safety.
