Safety is a priority at Southwest Gas 24/7 - our ongoing safety and damage prevention program helps to minimize the number of pipeline leaks. However, natural gas pipeline leaks can occur due to natural disasters, damage by digging and excavation, or corrosion.

Careless or unsafe excavating could damage the pipeline. This could result in a natural gas leak which has the potential to lead to evacuations, service outages, ignition, property damage, injury, or loss of life. A leak may be present if you:

**SMELL** – an unusual odor, like that of rotten eggs, which is the odorant added to natural gas.

> **HEAR** – a hissing or roaring sound coming from the ground or above-ground pipeline.

> > **SEE** – discolored vegetation surrounding a pipeline, or water or dirt blowing into the air.

## IF YOU SUSPECT A LEAK:

- Leave the vicinity immediately and do not use an automated door.
- · Warn others.
- Do not light a match, start or stop an engine, switch on or off lights or appliances, or do anything that might create a spark.
- From a safe place, call Southwest Gas and 911 immediately.
