

The minimum charge per meter per month is the basic service charge.

- 5. Non-Profit Group Living Facilities (facilities with six [6] or less beds) Eligibility Criteria
  In order for the customer to be considered a qualified non-profit group living facility, each of the following conditions must be met:
  - A. The facility must certify that it is operated by a corporation that has received a letter of determination by the Internal Revenue Service stating the corporation is tax-exempt due to its not-for-profit status under the Internal Revenue Code Section 501(c)(3).
  - B. The facility must be either a homeless shelter, transitional housing (e.g., for drug rehabilitation, a half-way house, etc.), a short- or long-term care facility (hospice, nursing homes, seniors' or children's homes), or a group home for physically or mentally disabled persons.

With the exception of homeless shelters, all facilities must certify that 100% of the residents (excluding caregiver) of the facility meet the California Alternate Rates for Energy eligibility standard for a single-person household. A single-person household is eligible for California Alternate Rates for Energy if the total gross annual income from all sources, both taxable and non-taxable, is not greater than \$29,300.

- 4. Customers who wrongfully declare eligibility or fail to notify the Company when they no longer meet the eligibility requirements may be rebilled for the period of ineligibility under their otherwise applicable rate schedule.
- 5. It is the responsibility of the Customer to notify the Company within 30 days of any changes in the Customer's eligibility status.
- 6. Non-Profit Group Living Facilities (facilities with seven [7] or more beds)
  - A. Eligibility Criteria

In order for the customer to be considered a qualified non-profit group living facility, each of the following conditions must be met:

- i) The facility must certify that it is operated by a corporation that has received a letter of determination by the Internal Revenue Service stating the corporation is tax-exempt due to its not-for-profit status under the Internal Revenue Code Section 501 (c)(3).
- ii) The facility must be either a homeless shelter, transitional housing (e.g., for drug rehabilitation, a half-way house, etc.), a short- or long-term care facility (hospice, nursing homes, seniors' or children's homes), or a group home for physically or mentally disabled persons.
- iii) With the exception of homeless shelters, all facilities must certify that 100% of the residents (excluding caregiver) of the facility meet the California Alternate Rates for Energy eligibility standard for a single-person household. A single-person household is eligible for California Alternate Rates for Energy if the total gross annual income from all sources, both taxable and non-taxable, is not greater than \$29,300.

# NOTICE TO INVESTOR OWNED UTILITIES PROVIDING SERVICE UNDER CARE AND LIEE (at 200% of the Federal Poverty Guideline Level)

Energy Division is issuing this notice to establish the income limitations for the California Alternate Rate for Energy Program (CARE) and the Low Income Energy Efficiency Program (LIEE).<sup>1</sup>

The Commission in Resolution E-3524, adopted February 19, 1998, ordered the Director of the Energy Division (Director) to communicate new income levels to carriers by letter not later than May 1 of each year. The Commission further ordered the Director to require energy utilities to file revised tariffs effective June 1 of each year reflecting the new income levels.

In Decision 05-10-044<sup>2</sup> income guidelines for the CARE program for Pacific Gas and Electric Company (PG&E), Southern California Edison Company (SCE), Southern California Gas Company (SoCalGas), San Diego Gas & Electric Company (SDG&E) and SouthWest Gas Company (SouthWest) became available to all, investor owned utility (IOU), customers with incomes between 175% and 200% of the Federal Poverty Guideline (FPG) levels. The same expanded income eligibility, at the 200% FPG criteria, was applied to the IOU Low-Income Energy Efficiency (LIEE) program participants. Therefore all low income CARE and LIEE applicants are subject to the same income qualification guidelines. Ordering paragraph 1 of Decision 06-12-036 added Sierra Pacific (Sierra) to the change in the CARE and LIEE income qualification guidelines to 200% from 175% of the Federal Poverty Guideline (FPG) level.

The process of determining the change in the income limitation for the CARE and LIEE programs is simple and is set forth in Appendix A of this letter. Following this process, the Energy Division has determined the revised income limits for 2007-2008 to be as follows:

### These income limits are effective from June 1, 2007, to May 31, 2008.

Note: The incremental difference between "1 or 2" and "3" (\$5,100) will always be less that the amount for each additional household member (\$7,100). The additional household member adder is applied to household member levels 5 and 6.

Rules for Computing Income Levels (As set forth in Resolution E-3524, dated February 19, 1998)

- (1) The prior period income levels are multiplied by a factor of one plus the inflation factor (Column  $a \cdot b = c$ ).
- (2) The inflation factor to be used is the "final" CPI-U (Consumer Price Index for all Urban Consumers) for the prior year, as published by the U.S. Department of Labor, Bureau of Labor Statistics. The inflation actor is usually available in January of each year.
- (3) The percentage increase factor is three digits to the right of the decimal. Examples: 2.0% = .020; 8.5% = .085.
- (4) All income level amounts are rounded to the nearest \$100. If the raw number end rounds to 50 or above, the number should be rounded to the next higher \$100. Examples: 19,326 = 19,300; 16,654 = 16,700.
- (5) The amount for "each additional" should be rounded to the difference between 3 and 4 household members. If the rounding differs, the amount for the "each additional" should be set to the difference between 3 and 4 household members.

<sup>3</sup> Column "d" contains rounded data for income levels 1 or 2, 3, and 4. The data in column "d" for income levels 5 and 6 contain the additional household member adder of \$7,100.

Pursuant to Resolution E-3524, the utilities are requested to file revised tariffs with the Energy Division reflecting the income levels noted above by **May 14, 2007.** The tariffs will become effective **June 1, 2007.** All tariffs, internet sites and printed materials about CARE and/or LIEE are to display the income eligibility guidelines up through a household of six, as shown in the above table.
