Pursuant to NAC 704.339(10)(c), adopted by the Public Utilities Commission of Nevada (Commission) on January 13, 2005, a third-party vendor may charge a customer a fee for the use of a credit card to make a payment, provided the fee has been reviewed and approved by the Commission.

On October 7, 2005, the Commission approved Southwest Gas' application filed under Advice Letter No. 414, which allows customers to make payments via third-party vendors that charge customers a transaction fee. Customers electing to utilize this payment option pay the fee directly to the third-party vendor. The current transaction fee is \$1.00. The third-party vendor has increased the transaction fee to \$1.50. Southwest Gas requests the Commission approve the filing with an effective date of May 1, 2013.

Southwest Gas respectfully requests that the Commission approve the above-referenced tariff sheet, which updates the third-party transaction fee. This filing is made in accordance with Nevada Administrative Codes, NAC Chapter 703, of the Commission's Rules and Practices and Procedure.

Southwest Gas Corporation is filing Advice Letter No. 482 to update the charges a third-party vendor charges customers for paystation transaction fees.

Pursuant to NAC 704.339(10)(c), adopted by the Public Utilities Commission of Nevada (Commission) on January 13, 2005, a third-party vendor may charge a customer a fee for the use of a credit card to make a payment, provided the fee has been reviewed and approved by the Commission. Southwest Gas is updating its Nevada Gas Tariff No. 7 to reflect an increase in third-party fees for paystation payments from \$1.00 to \$1.50.

A consumer session for this filing is not required.

Southwest Gas is requesting approval to modify the following in its Nevada Gas Tariff No. 7: Statement of Rates – Other Service Charges, Sheet No. 15.

¹ NRS 704.069 Commission required to conduct consumer session for certain rate cases; Commission required to conduct general consumer session annually in certain counties.

^{1.} The Commission shall conduct a consumer session to solicit comments from the public in any matter pending before the Commission pursuant to <u>NRS 704.061</u> to <u>704.110</u>, inclusive, in which:

⁽a) A public utility has filed a general rate application, an application to recover the increased cost of purchased fuel, purchased power, or natural gas purchased for resale or an application to clear its deferred accounts; and

⁽b) The changes proposed in the application will result in an increase in annual gross operating revenue, as certified by the applicant, in an amount that will exceed \$50,000 or 10 percent of the applicant's annual gross operating revenue, whichever is less.

^{2.} In addition to the case-specific consumer sessions required by subsection 1, the Commission shall, during each calendar year, conduct at least one general consumer session in the county with the largest population in this state and at least one general consumer session in the county with the second largest population in this state. At each general consumer session, the Commission shall solicit comments from the public on issues concerning public utilities. Not later than 60 days after each general consumer session, the Commission shall submit the record from the general consumer session to the Legislative Commission.
